The USDA recently announced its continuous conservation practice - CP 38 as a means to benefit wildlife and conservation practices throughout the United States. This program recognizes that each state has a variety of landscape needs and allows the decision on land qualifications to be made on an individual state basis.

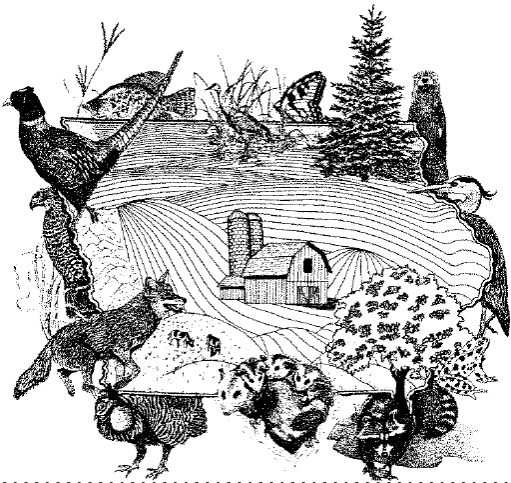
In the state of Iowa, up to 27,700 acres of land can be enrolled in the program. Landowners will receive rental and incentive payments to restore critical habitat for their land in qualifying areas. This program will benefit many wildlife species - from pheasant to bobolinks to butterflies - as well as improving water quality and preventing soil erosion.

The program could not come at a better time as habitat loss in Iowa is at a critical stage. More than 800 square miles of grassland - an area larger than many Iowa counties - is slated to return to row crops by 2010.

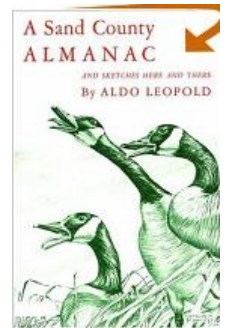
