

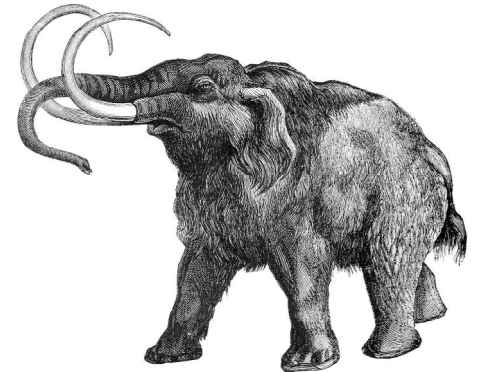
Opportunities await at the

The bison are back! The bull and two cows returned to the prairie on May 22nd. Close to 200 people turned out to see the bison rumble their way out of the trailer and back to their home on the hillside. We are expecting at least one calf this summer. Keep your eye on the herd. The new baby will be a bright red spot in the grass when it is born, but will grow quickly throughout the summer.

The mammoth tooth that was brought in to the Prairie Heritage Center last fall is nearing the completion of the preservation process. The preliminary stages of the exhibit process are underway. Expect the mammoth exhibit on display this fall.



Wall panels for the Mill Creek Archaeological exhibit have been ordered. Additional archaeological pieces will be added and text will round out this display.



A “Cuddeback Corner” has been added to the hallway. This display board will be covered with candid shots of wildlife. Future plans include wildlife habitat management information. Check out the fascinating photos.
